THE EVENT will be a State Championship Hillclimb and **ROUND Three** of the **2020 VICTORIAN HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP** to be conducted at the Mt Leura Lookout Road, Camperdown on Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th September 2020. ***This event will be conducted over the long course.***

The Promoters reserve the right to stipulate the number of entries for the Meeting, and select entries in excess of such number at their absolute discretion. The maximum number of entries [NUMBER], accepted in order of receipt. The Promoter reserves the right to refuse entry in accordance with NCR83 of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

COMPETITION

- THERE WILL BE NO PRACTICE ON Saturday 28 or Sunday 29 of March 2020.
- The starting procedure shall be a single car standing start.

PERSONS ELIGIBLE The event shall be open to members of clubs affiliated with Motorsport Australia who are holders of a Motorsport Australia Level 2S/2SJ or higher Licence.

SCRUTINY

On Saturday 28th March 2020 Scrutiny will commence at 12:00 pm and conclude at 1:00 pm.
On Sunday 29th March 2020 Scrutiny will commence at 8:00 am and conclude at 9:00 am. All vehicles must be scrutineered and passed for practice and competition prior to participation. Motorsport Australia Licences, Competition Records and current Car Club Membership Cards must be produced at scrutiny book-in and on request during the meeting.

DRIVERS BRIEFING

THE ATTENDANCE OF ALL DRIVERS IS COMPULSORY AT THE DRIVERS BRIEFINGS. Competitors will be required to attend the drivers briefing to be held at 1.00pm on Saturday 28th March 2020 and at 9:30am Sunday 29th March 2020. Drivers will be required to sign an attendance sheet. The starting order will be advised at the Drivers Briefing.

TIMING will be electronic, and be to one hundredth of a second. Event winners will be those Drivers with the fastest time for a single run in each class. In the event of a tie, the next fastest official time of each Driver will determine the event winner. Timekeepers will be considered Judges of Fact.

PROTESTS Any protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current NCR.

ABANDONMENT The Promoters reserve the right to abandon, postpone or cancel the meeting in accordance with NCR 59 of the current Motorsport Australia Manual. The meeting will be postponed to a date to be determined if a **TOTAL FIRE BAN** has been declared for the **SOUTH WEST DISTRICT** for the day of the event.

SAFETY - DRIVER Drivers must wear a helmet to a standard listed in the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport, and be deemed by the Scrutineers of the Event to be in a suitable condition for motorsport use, non flammable clothing, suitable footwear, and goggles or visors with lens other than glass in open car. All apparel, including helmets, must comply with the requirements of Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

SAFETY - CARS The attention of Competitors is drawn to Schedules A and B of the General Requirements for Cars and Drivers of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport in which all vehicle requirements are listed in detail. In particular, fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual and all vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.

ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES. Any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other section of the competition venue/course

under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

DAMAGE TO INFRASTRUCTURE AND EQUIPMENT

Any damage to the Infrastructure both portable and fixed at the Mt Leura by a competitor and or their vehicle will become the financial responsibility of the said competitor to replace or repair the damage to a standard approved by the Venue operator (BLCC) and the Venue Owner (Corangamite Shire).

REFUELLING Refuelling must be carried out in the designated area only.

Closed vehicles shall be required to have a full driver's side window that is closed or a driver's side window net that is in place whilst competing or travelling on the track. This requirement applies to all Speed events run by BLCC. It is in addition to the requirements set by Motorsport Australia above and is in the interest of competitor safety.

NOISE

All competing cars must be fitted with a device that restricts the exhaust noise to a level of 95db (A) measured at a distance of 30 meters on a drive by test under full acceleration. Vehicles may be tested during practice and competition on both days. *Any competitor's car that exceeds this limit will be warned. A second offence will result in expulsion from the remainder of the meeting.*

COMPETITION NUMBERS

Competitors who have Registered VHC numbers will be given preference for that number. Please advise on the entry form if this is the case.

AWARDS

Trophies will be awarded for first, second and third placing's in each class. In addition, a trophy will be awarded for the Fastest Time of the day and the fastest female competitor, Trophies will be presented at the conclusion of the competition.

COMPETING CARS Competing cars must be kept in the paddock area during the running of the meeting. Competitors trailers must be parked in the trailer park or other designated areas, and must not be parked in spectator areas.

CAMPING

If camping please camp within the showgrounds and keep noise to a minimum before 9.00am and after 6.00pm. There will be an administration fee of \$25 for camping to cover the costs incurred by the local camping facility provider. This Fee is to be paid when booking in at Entry Verification.

- other participants acting dangerously or with lack of skills;
- high levels of noise exposure;
- acts of violence and other harmful acts (whether intentional or inadvertent) committed by persons attending or participating in the event; and
- the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY, RELEASE & INDEMNITY

In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motorsport Activities, **I agree:**

- to **release** Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
 - my **death**;
 - any **physical or mental injury** (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
 - the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a **disease**;
 - the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other **condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behaviour, course of conduct or state of affairs**:
 - that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community; or
 - that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community,howsoever arising from my participation in or attendance at the Motorsport Activities;
- to **indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified** Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motorsport Activities at my own risk.

I understand that:

- nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of Motorsport Australia and the Entities as the supplier of the Motorsport Activities and Recreational Services;
- nothing in this document prevents Motorsport Australia and the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability;
- nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded, however the liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities is limited to the minimum liability allowable by law;
- nothing in this document precludes me from making a claim under a Motorsport Australia insurance policy where I am expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy; and

- c. "Motorsport Activities" means any motorsport activities or Recreational Services which are permitted or approved which Motorsport Australia regulates or administers or otherwise are under the responsibility / control of Motorsport Australia;
- d. "Motorsport Australia" means the Confederation of Australia Motor Sport Ltd. trading as Motorsport Australia;
- e. "Reckless Conduct" means conduct where the supplier of the recreational services is aware, or should reasonably have been aware, of a significant risk that the conduct could result in personal injury to another person and engages in the conduct despite the risk and without adequate justification;
- f. "Recreational Services" means (unless otherwise defined in this document) services that consist of participation in:
 - a. a sporting activity; or
 - b. a similar leisure time pursuit or any other activity that:
 - i. involves a significant degree of physical exertion or physical risk; and
 - ii. is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.
